Devon County Council propose to make this under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to introduce in Okehampton:

RESTRICTED ROAD (30MPH BY VIRTUE OF STREETLIGHTING) on Chichacott Road from Crediton Road for 200 metres northwest \& on Crediton Road from 12 metres southwest of Chichacott Road northeast to 45 metres northeast of the access road to "development to the north of Crediton Road"; 30MPH SPEED LIMIT on Chichacott Road from 200 metres northwest of Crediton Road for 33 metres north.

## Statement of Reasons

This 30 mph speed limit is proposed further to the construction of a new housing development adjacent to Crediton Road to make access to the development and the new roundabout safer. It is proposed to extend the 30 mph speed limit on Chichacott Road to make access to properties safer.
