Statement of Reason:

During the COVID-19 pandemic, temporary restrictions were introduced in July 2020 to temporarily Prohibit All Vehicles, except for cycles, on short lengths of Homefield Road and on the Service road from Bicton Place to North Lawn Court. This route forms part of the E3 cycle corridor that connects Redhayes Bridge, Whipton, Heavitree and the City Centre and is part of Exeter's strategic cycle network. With a largely positive feedback it is proposed to make the restrictions permanent.

Specifically, the restrictions proposed are for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians) and for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.
