Statement of Reason:

During the COVID-19 pandemic a temporary restriction was introduced in June 2020 to Prohibit All Vehicles except for buses and cycles on a short length of Wonford Road, between Victoria Park Road and Deepdene Park to improve safety for cycling. This route is part of the E9 cycle corridor that connects the Newcourt / Pynes Hill area to the RD&E Hospital and the City Centre and is part of Exeter's strategic cycle network. Therefore, with a largely positive feedback it is proposed to make the restriction permanent.

Specifically, the restrictions proposed are for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians) and for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.
