Devon County Council (Ludwell Lane, Exeter) (No Waiting At Any Time) Amendment Order 5870 to introduce No Waiting at any Time on a specified length of Ludwell Lane, Exeter

Statement of Reasons

During the COVID-19 pandemic a temporary restriction was introduced in June 2020 to Prohibit Motor Vehicles on a length of Ludwell Lane to reduce traffic and improve safety for walking and cycling. It is now being proposed to introduce a permanent prohibition of motor vehicles at the junction of Pynes Hill. This route is part of the E9 cycle corridor that connects the Newcourt / Pynes Hill area to the RD&E Hospital and the City Centre and is part of Exeter's strategic cycle network. This prohibition would replace the existing am and pm prohibitions on the lane.

We are also proposing to introduce No Waiting At Any Time (Double Yellow Lines) in a new turning head at the western side of the new prohibition to ensure it is kept clear.

Specifically, the restrictions proposed are for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians) and for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.
