Statement of Reasons

It is proposed to extend the speed limit on the Road from Moor View to de Bathe Cross due to concerns raised over safety at the junction with Cottles View. A safety audit was undertaken highlighting that the forward visibility to the speed limit terminal signs was insufficient and therefore, it is proposed to extend the 30mph limit further out to improve the forward visibility of signs.

Specifically, the restrictions are proposed to avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, will facilitate the passage on the road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians) and will preserve or improve the amenities of the area which the road runs through.
