

Devon County Council (Old Rydon Lane Area, Exeter) (One-Way & Contraflow Cycling) Order

Devon County Council makes the following order under sections 1, 2, part IV of schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 & of all other enabling powers

1. This order comes into force and may be cited as "Devon County Council (Old Rydon Lane Area, Exeter) (One-Way & Contraflow Cycling) Order "
2. In this order:
cycle lane means the area of the carriageway of Old Rydon Lane specified in schedule 2 which is bounded to the West by a traffic sign of a type to diagram 960.1 and to the East by a traffic sign of a type to diagram 956 specified in The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 and placed on that carriageway.
pedal cycle means a pedal bicycle or pedal tricycle not being in either case a motor vehicle
3. Save as provided in article 4 no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to proceed in the length of the road specified in schedule 1 other than in the direction specified in column 3 of that schedule
4. Nothing in article 3 applies if the vehicle is:
 - (a) being used in an emergency for fire, police or ambulance purposes
 - (b) being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties
 - (c) a mechanical road cleansing vehicle
 - (d) a pedal cycle using the contraflow cycle lane
5. Save as provided in articles 6 and 7 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle other than a pedal cycle travelling in the direction specified in column 3 of schedule 2; to enter, or wait or proceed in the cycle lane specified in that schedule
6. Nothing in article 5 makes it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to enter, wait or proceed in the cycle lane for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to
 - (a) be used for the removal of an obstruction to traffic
 - (b) be used for police, fire or ambulance purposes in an emergency
 - (c) be used in the service of a local authority or water authority or with the permission of any such authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that whilst being used it is necessary for the vehicle to wait in the cycle lane
 - (d) avoid an accident
7. Nothing in article 5 applies to the driving of a mechanical road cleansing vehicle or gully emptying machine or to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform
8. Save as provided in article 9 no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to proceed in the length of the road specified in schedule 3 other than in the direction specified in column 3 of that schedule
9. Nothing in article 8 applies if the vehicle is:
 - (a) being used in an emergency for fire, police or ambulance purposes

- (b) being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties
- (c) a mechanical road cleansing vehicle
- (d) a pedal cycle

10. The order listed in schedule 4 is revoked as indicated in that schedule.
