Statement of Reasons

As a result of concerns being raised by the Parish Council and residents regarding the speed of vehicles through Lewdown, it is proposed to revoke the western part of the current 40mph speed limit from Cannon Barn Cottages to east of The Market Place to 30mph by virtue of street lighting and traffic order. This will improve road safety through the built-up/urban area of Lewdown.

In addition, it is proposed to make adjustments to update descriptions to ensure that measurements in the traffic order correspond with existing on street signage.

Specifically, the order will preserve or improve the amenities of the area through which the road runs.
