Devon County Council (Queen Street Area, Newton Abbot) (Traffic Regulation) Order

Devon County Council ("Council") makes the following order under sections 1, 2, part IV of schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers

PART 1 GENERAL

- 1.1 This order comes into force _____ and may be cited as "Devon County Council (Queen Street Area, Newton Abbot) (Traffic Regulation) Order _____"
- 1.2 Except where the context otherwise requires the following expressions have these meanings assigned to them
- 1984 Act** means Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984
- Council permit** means a permit issued by the Council or its agent which will refer to one vehicle only and will be valid for a specified period. At all times that the vehicle is within a restricted area the permit must be displayed in either of the two following locations
- 1 in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen,
 - 2 in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the permit is to be exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle
- disabled person's badge** has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000
- disabled person's vehicle** means a vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled person's badge and is a vehicle which immediately before or after any period of waiting allowed by virtue of a provision of a kind required by the Local Authorities' Traffic orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 to be included in an order under the 1984 Act has been or is to be driven by a disabled person or has been or is to be used for carrying disabled persons as passengers
- emergency service vehicle** means a vehicle being used for ambulance, coastguard, fire or police purposes in relation to an emergency or whilst in pursuit of duties
- excursion or tour** has the same meaning given in section 137(1) of the Transport Act 1985
- goods** includes postal packets of any description and the collection and delivery in relation to any goods including the checking of the goods for the purpose of delivery and collection
- hackney carriage** has the same meaning as in the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 and The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976
- local bus** means a public service vehicle used for the provision of a local service not being an excursion or tour
- local service** has the meaning given in section 2 of the Transport Act 1985
- parking place** is that part of the carriageway where vehicles or vehicles of any class may wait as set out in section 32(4)(b) of the 1984 Act
- pedal cycle** means a pedal bicycle or pedal tricycle not being in either case a motor vehicle
- postal packets** has the same meaning as in section 27(2) of the Postal Services Act 2011
- private hire vehicle** means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted to seat fewer than eight passengers other than a hackney carriage or public service vehicle which is provided for hire with the services of a driver for the purpose of carrying passengers
- public service vehicle** has the same meaning as in the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981
- servicing** means the maintenance, inspection or repair of any plant or equipment within premises in or adjacent to that length of road
- 1.3 In this order
- (a) any reference to an enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended or any successive enactment
 - (b) any reference to an article, part or table refers to the corresponding article, part or table in this order unless stated and except where the context otherwise requires a reference to a numbered or lettered paragraph or sub-paragraph, is a reference to the

paragraph or sub-paragraph bearing that number or letter in the article or table, or (in the case of a sub-paragraph) paragraph in which the reference occurs

- 1.4 Nothing in this order applies to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform
- 1.5 The provisions of this order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from the provisions of any regulations made or having effect as if made under the 1984 Act or by or under any other enactment

PART 2 PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES: Queen Street (eastern section)

- 2.1 Except as provided in article 2.2 it is a contravention for a person to cause or permit a motor vehicle to proceed in the lengths of road specified in Table 2

- 2.2 Nothing in article 2.1 applies if the vehicle is:-
 - (a) accessing an adjacent property
 - (b) an emergency service vehicle;
 - (c) a local bus;
 - (d) being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) being used for a specified period in connection with any of the following operations in or adjacent to that length of road:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) in connection with statutory undertakers plant or equipment; or
 - (iv) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length of road;
 - (f) being used with a Council permit for other essential purposes;
 - (g) a hackney carriage or private hire vehicle;
 - (h) accessing or making use of a designated parking place within the area;
 - (i) a vehicle defined in Part 3 that is accessing Queen Street (western section)

PART 3 PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES: Queen Street (western section)

- 3.1 Except as provided in article 3.2 it is a contravention for a person to cause or permit a motor vehicle to proceed in the lengths of road specified in Table 3

- 3.2 Nothing in article 3.1 applies if the vehicle is:-
 - (a) an emergency service vehicle;
 - (b) a local bus;
 - (c) being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) being used for a specified period in connection with any of the following operations in or adjacent to that length of road:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) in connection with statutory undertakers plant or equipment; or
 - (iv) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length of road;
 - (e) being used with a Council permit for other essential purposes;
 - (f) proceeding in a **west bound** direction and is less than 32.6 feet in length requiring access to properties for the purposes of loading and unloading goods;
 - (g) a disabled person’s vehicle;
 - (h) being used for the delivery or collection of postal packets to premises in or adjacent to that length of road;
 - (i) being used for the purposes of servicing or loading/unloading goods to premises in or adjacent to that length of road at any time;
 - (j) a hackney carriage or private hire vehicle

PART 4

PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES: Devon Square & Oak Place

- 4.1 Except as provided in article 4.2 it is a contravention for a person to cause or permit a motor vehicle to proceed in the lengths of road specified in Table 4
- 4.2 Nothing in article 4.1 applies if the vehicle is
- (a) accessing an adjacent property
 - (b) being used in an emergency for fire, police or ambulance purposes
 - (c) being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties
 - (d) a mechanical road cleansing vehicle
 - (e) a pedal cycle

PART 5 **PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES: King Street**

5.1 It is a contravention for a person to cause or permit a motor vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified in Table 5

PART 6 ONE WAY: Hopkins Lane

- 6.1 Except as provided in article 6.2 no person shall cause to be driven a vehicle in the length of road specified in table 6 other than in the direction specified in that table

- 6.2 Nothing in article 6.1 applies if the vehicle is
 - (a) being used in an emergency for fire, police or ambulance purposes
 - (b) a mechanical road cleansing vehicle

PART 7 WIDTH RESTRICTION 2.0 metres (6 feet 6 inches): Hopkins Lane

7.1 No person shall cause or permit a vehicle, the width of which inclusive of any load on the vehicle exceeds 2.0 metres (6 feet 6 inches), to proceed in the length of road specified in table 7

PART 8 LENGTH RESTRICTION 10.0 metres (32 feet 6 inches)
Devon Square, King Street and Queen Street

8.1 No person shall permit any vehicle or combination of vehicles exceeding 10.0 metres (32 feet 6 inches) in length to proceed over the lengths of road specified in table 8 and in the directions specified in that table
