Statement of Reasons

As part of the ongoing development in the area, vehicular access will no longer be required along two sections of Harts Lane and therefore it is proposed to introduce Prohibition of Motor Vehicles to restrict access to the specified lengths of road and to improve cycle/walking facilities.

Specifically, the restrictions are proposed to avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising and will preserve or improve the amenities of the area which the road runs through.
