## Statement of Reasons

As part of the new housing development, it is proposed to introduce a prohibition of motor vehicles along sections of Crannaford Lane to reduce traffic flow through the development and provide a safe route for pedestrians and cyclists. It is also proposed to adjust the speed limit at the Southern end to match London Road and reduce sign clutter.

Specifically, the restrictions are proposed to avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising and will facilitate the passage on the road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians).
