Statement of Reasons

Due to the construction of a housing development on Frogmore Road, East Budleigh, it is proposed to extend the 30mph speed limit to include the entrance to the new development. This will improve road safety for all road users including pedestrians and cyclists.

Specifically, the restrictions are proposed to avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, to facilitate the passage on the road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians) and to preserve or improve the amenities of the area through which the road runs.
