Statement of Reasons

As part of the Dawlish Housing Infrastructure Fund (HIF), a new link road and bridge has been constructed to create a connection from the A379 to Secmaton Farm (Phase 1). It has been agreed to introduce a 30mph speed limit on the new link road which has been constructed by Devon County Council. The road is unlit (no street lighting) and therefore a 30mph speed limit is required and 30mph repeater signs will be installed in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions (TSRGD).

Continuation of the link road through to Elm Grove Road (Phase 2), future housing and infrastructure will be completed by future developers.

Specifically, the order if made will avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising and preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs.
